



Vinci Building brings enterprise education programme to schools in Bristol

Vinci Building, the UK construction division of Vinci Construction, is bringing enterprise and employability skills to primary schools in Bristol as part of its Social Value strategy. The aim is to help children develop skills for work and life from an early age and to boost awareness of the careers available in construction.

Vinci Building has partnered with 2B Enterprising who have developed an innovative enterprise skills programme called The Bumbles of Honeywood. This programme is exclusively focussed on primary education and is delivered in collaboration with commercial business partners who financially support the programme and engage in the workshop activities. To date this unique model has partnered 150 businesses with over 300 schools across the UK.

Vinci Building has selected the schools based on their proximity to work it is undertaking – including Bristol.

The programme is built around a series of beautifully illustrated books and interactive extension activities that explore the enterprising nature of honeybees and other characters to help children develop skills such as resilience, problem solving, leadership, communication, and teamwork.
